

Web Scripting for Applications Coursework 2012/13

This module is assessment in two parts – with 40% coming from coursework and 60% coming from the end of semester exam (in January).

The coursework is submitted in the form of a log containing your solutions for the exercises and activities from the labs. This will be created automatically from the work you have uploaded to the *foliocube* system – you will receive a copy of this work as a word document via email.

Because of the way that the teaching material is layered from week to week, it is vital that you attempt the exercises in sequence (i.e. do not attempt to jump around missing weeks out). The portfolio system is designed so that work that you upload can be seen, shared and commented on by others. To ensure that independent learning can be identified and assessed, many of the exercises have the opportunity for differing designs and solutions. They also vary in complexity.

Grades will be awarded along these lines

40-50 Some exercises with some screen shots showing attempts at some of the exercises and activities. To achieve a passing grade of 40, it is expected that at least half of the exercises will have been attempted from <i>most</i> of the weeks.
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The module has been structured to encourage you to perform tasks as the weeks progress (which is vital in modules which contain both theoretical and practical material). If you do not attempt exercises every week, you will find this module difficult. Remember that the portfolio system is not just for completed / finished work – you should also upload non-working solutions where you need assistance (attempts at solutions count towards your final grade).

50-60 Most of the exercises (well represented with accompanying information) will be shown – most of them will be correct, with at least 70% of each weeks exercises having been completed.

The profile of students who achieve a better mark in this module are those that attempt exercises regularly and participate online, uploading and commenting on others work. Students who did not attend, left all the work until the end or did not engage with the subject area until the end achieved lower grades. There is a direct correlation between final exam grades and work achieved throughout the module.

70+ All of the exercises will have been attempted (with most of them being correct). Every one will be well represented with appropriate accompanying information.
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
